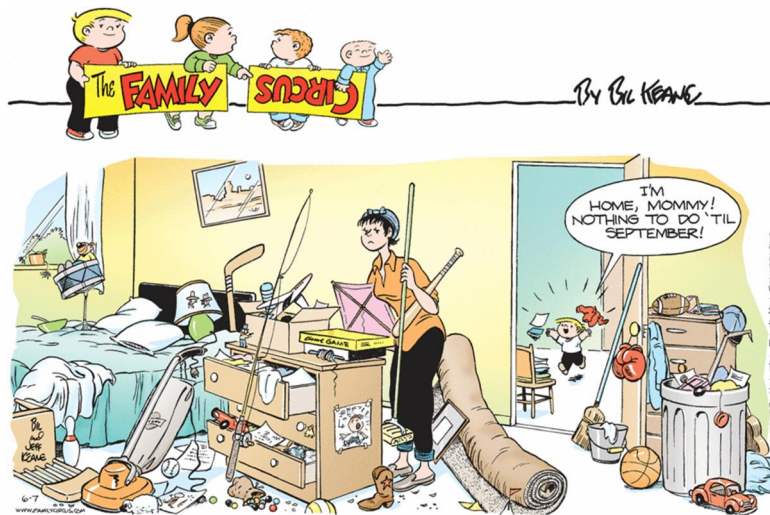




## FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY: SUMMER BREAK AND PLANS

In preparation for the Annual Meeting, I had to take the time to think about all of the projects we worked on this year and the ones yet to be finished. Despite my main goal for the year of listening and watching before really diving in, we still managed to bring forth some really fun programming and increase energy within the synagogue and the Jewish community as a whole. 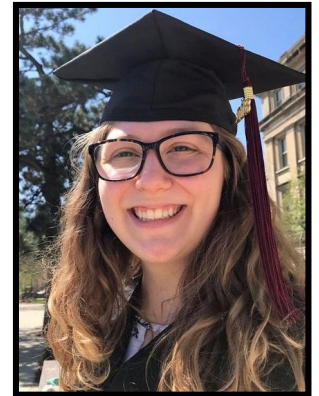

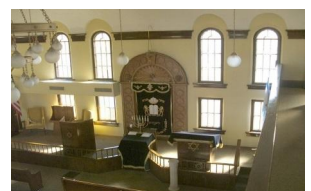

**OTTUMWA, IA SYNAGOGUE CLOSES**

B'Nai Jacob Synagogue, a Conservative congregation in Ottumwa, Iowa closed recently. It was established in 1898 and was originally an Orthodox synagogue. It constructed its current synagogue building in 1915, and joined the Conservative movement in the 1950s. By the turn of the 20th century, Ottumwa had fewer than 50 Jewish families. Some families were extremely observant, "wearing two types of phylacteries", while others believed "in no Judaism at all. In the early 1900s, many people called the area around the 300, 400 and 500 blocks of Main Street "Jew Town" because the stores in the neighborhood were mostly owned by Jewish families, many of who lived above their stores. In 1907, the congregation was located at 404 E. Main St., and had 15 members out of an estimated Jewish population of 150. By 1919, the Jewish population of Ottumwa had risen to 412 and the congregation had moved one block into the current building. B'Nai Jacob's Renaissance or Deco Vernacular synagogue building at 529 East Main Street (at Union Street) was constructed in 1915 by architects, L.T. Chrisman and company and George M. Kerns. As originally built, the bimah was in the center of the sanctuary, but in an earlier modernization of the building, the central bimah was removed. The woodwork around the Torah ark is original, as is the 7-branched menorah in front of the ark. The sanctuary features a woman's gallery against the south-west wall, built, although it is rarely used. The separation of men and women at B'Nai Jacob ended when one woman's health problems prevented her from climbing the stairs to the balcony. By 1960, the Jewish population was estimated at 175 and by 2010, the congregation on a typical Saturday morning had shrunk to seven or so. The building was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 2004.(reference number 4000815), and underwent major historic restoration in 2004–2005.

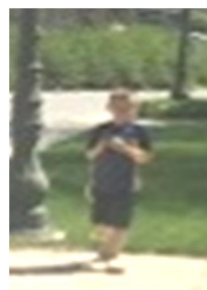
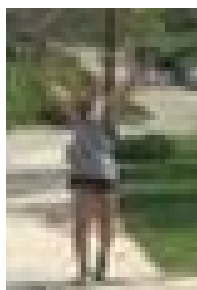

### TIFERETH ISRAEL SYNAGOGUE MEMORIAL TREE PLANTING

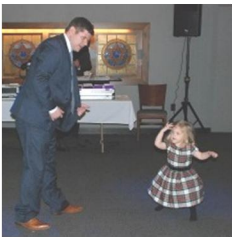

On **June 17, 2018**, we will be planting 10-White Oak Trees on the east lawn of the synagogue. These trees will help with our fundraising efforts, provide for wildlife, help the environment, and stand as a living memorial for your loved ones. In addition, each tree planted will be designated with an aluminum plaque that will honor your loved ones with a name and short message (an \$80 value). #### White Oaks

White oak grows slow (approximately 1 foot per year) and has a long live span (350-500 years). It commonly attains a height of 80 to 100 feet with a diameter of 3 to 4 feet. Fall color is wine color eventually fading to brown. The leaves of white oak often persist through mid-winter adding to the attractiveness of this tree.

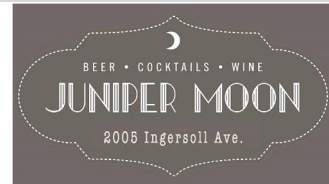

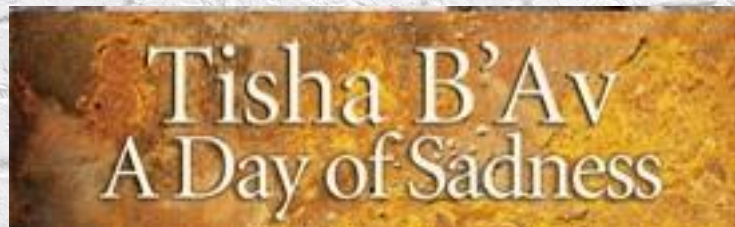

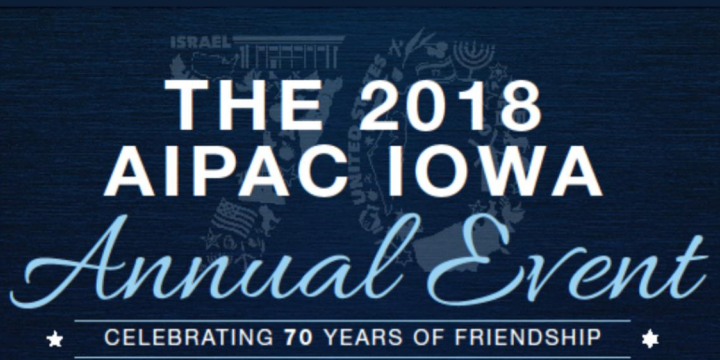


### Tisha B'Av Starts July 21st After Shabbat Has Ended

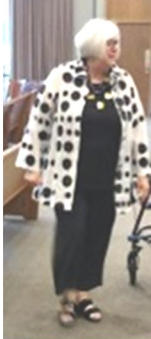
