FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY:

Elul, The Shofar & Us

"Midrash tells us that our name, *Yisrael*, when vocalized differently, can become "*Yashir Eil*" - "God will sing." We are God's song in this world. Full of potential for harmony - tension, joy, sorrow, anger, comfort, pain, and majesty - God sings through each of us. Elul is the time to focus and question: what Godsong will be heard through my life in the coming year?

Chasidic wisdom likens each of us to a shofar. Were it not for the breath of God blowing through me, I would make no sound at all. Elul is the time to tune up, sharpen our skills, and be a song that is worthy of being

heard.

The shofar is narrow at the beginning and wide at the end. May we remember to begin with ourselves, and then open our hearts and our ears and our eyes to understand that we too can be bigger - we can be wider - and our smallest actions can make a huge difference in the world.

Elul: Spiritual Preparation for the High Holidays Sunday, August 12th at 12:30pm (after STEP)

You would not run a marathon without preparation.

Jewish tradition offers us the month of Elul to help us prepare for the marathon of the High Holy Days, In the cycle of the Jewish year, the period from 1 Elul through Yom Kippur commemorates the 40 days that Moses spent on Mount Sinai, receiving and transcribing the second set of tablets. It is a time for examining our souls, making T'shuvah and preparing for the Days of Awe. In this class, we will explore how spiritual preparation during Elul can deepen and enrich our experience of the High Holy Days. The class will be taught by Christine Dietz, Ph.D., LISW and doctoral student in Jewish Spirituality. Christine is a graduate of the Lev Shomea Institute for Spiritual Direction in the Jewish tradition. Light refreshments will be provided.

A Personal Journey to Share with Friends A collaborative project of TIS and TBJ Chai Mitzvah combines study, ritual and social action, providing the framework for a meaningful Jewish journey.

There are five components to the 12 month Chai Mitzvah experience:

- Group study Meet monthly with a set curriculum
- Independent study choose a Jewish topic to explore
- Ritual choose a ritual or spiritual practice to include into your life
- Social Action Either individually or as a group
- Celebrate! At the end of the 12 months, receive a certificate, and have a tree planted in Israel in your honor through Chai Mitzvah's partnership with the Jewish National Fund.




