



FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY: Learning and Growing in the New Year

I hope that your summers have all been full of love, laughter and lots of sun. I also hope that the school year, for those who go, has gotten off to a fantastic start! I'm really looking forward to going back to school myself at Beit Sefer Shalom, where this year I'll be the lead 3rd grade teacher. One of the highlights of my job is all the time I get to spend with kids learning about Judaism together through stories, games and songs and I can't wait to see everyone else back at BSS!

Speaking of learning, it is always a big treat to take some time to do learning for myself. It helps me grow personally, but it also helps me be a better rabbi for you. On August 14th-15th, I was again privileged to go to AIPAC's annual rabbinic symposium, through a very generous grant from AIPAC's Synagogue Initiative. It was only 24 hours, but it was 24 hours jam-packed with thought-provoking speakers and lectures. I heard from people all across the political spectrum and took the time to hear more about Russia's Middle East policy (it is complex), what the situation is in Iran right now, and what the future may hold (also complex) and got to be in a "ask anything you want" closed-to-the-press Q&A session with NY Times columnist Bret Stephens. All of this, plus I was gifted two interesting books--Thou Shalt Innovate, which I have yet to read, and Jerusalem, Drawn and Quartered which was a fascinating read about a woman's year living in the four quarters of the Old City, the challenges she faced personally, all she learned about the experiences of her neighbors and what that means for Israel's future. It was an unusual book selection for AIPAC as it was much more personal and unconventional, but I appreciated AIPAC even more for stretching themselves with this choice of gift and having the speaker come and talk to a diverse rabbinic audience. I also



came home with a reading list of other books that I have yet to explore! I look forward to sharing with all of you what I learned and also hope to learn from you as we discuss some of these books in an Israel-themed book club in the upcoming year.

Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur and Sukkot are also great times for re-engaging with learning about your Judaism. We are changing up the Alternative Service for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur so they feel a little more like Acoustic Shabbat. Those who finished the Hebrew classes over the summer can take time during services to practice reading (and hopefully recognizing!) words that you've heard for so many years. We are offering some really interesting classes on Yom Kippur afternoon and hope that will be a kick-off for what promises to be a really exciting year of Adult Ed., including a joint year-long class with the Temple, an Intro to Judaism class and more! Like last year, on the mornings of Sukkot you'll have the chance to shake the lulav and etrog, even if you have never done it before. And, thanks to a generous donor, our new sukkah has already arrived! It's something else we'll have to learn how to put together: it will



cover the entire back courtyard behind the sanctuary and we are excited! It's only the beginning of the year and I hope you'll notice as you flip through the bulletin that there is so much to look forward to, learn about, and enjoy! This year, I invite you to learn something new about your Judaism and may that exploration bring you closer to God, Judaism and of course Tifereth Israel Synagogue.

10Q begins September 9th, 2018

Here in the Diaspora, a deeply meaningful part of partnering with the Israeli Masorti Movement, the Conservative Movement in Israel, is knowing we are making a real difference in Israel's future. We are strengthening Jewish tradition; values of democracy, pluralism, egalitarianism and social inclusion; and promoting the core Zionist vision of Israel's founding. And nowhere can we see this more clearly than our support for Masorti's NOAM Zionist Youth Movement.



NOAM (an acronym for No'ar Masorti or Masorti Youth) has over 1600 kids between the ages of 10 and 18, organized in 21 branches throughout Israel. NOAM teaches Jewish traditions and values and trains its members to become leaders in NOAM and in Israel. Importantly, while NOAM engages kids who are part of existing Masorti families, all others are welcome who want to engage with a modern, open, form of traditional Judaism. Among NOAM's key activities is Camp Ramah NOAM, a two-week sleep-away camp, which is the only traditionally Jewish, egalitarian camp in Israel. Additionally, NOAM Netaim is a special program to integrate kids with disabilities into Ramah NOAM camping, based on the core Masorti values of respect, acceptance, and the vision of B'tselem Elohim, that that each human being is made in God's image.

Camp is now underway, and we are excited that NOAM has a record-breaking number of participants. This year 711 members and activists took part in Ramah NOAM, for the third year being held in the Hanaton Forest in the Galilee. If you check out the photos in this post, along with a special NOAM Ramah in action video in the Masorti Theater, you can see girls and boys from all over the Israel who have come together to live in the wild, and through intense and fun activities, to learn, to lead, to practice Judaism.

Israel Contributes to a Cleaner World

In an era of booming populations, shrinking resources and environmental degradation, Israel leads the world in such critical fields as solar power generation and seawater desalination. As nations struggle to make the best use of their resources, Israel's cutting edge technologies promise to improve the health and living standards of hundreds of millions across the globe, while making industry more efficient and minimizing the environmental impact of human activities.

Israel's plan to break from gasoline dependence is providing structure and predictability to the marketplace, combining long-term public sector commitment with regulatory stability to send a clear message that innovation will have a home in Israel. Through investments in basic science and industrial R&D, and the launching of pilot programs and full scale-ups for promising technology, Israel is taking the lead in confronting one of the most pressing security issues of our time. A country of under 8 million people, Israel alone cannot end gasoline's global monopoly nor end the West's dependence on hostile petro-regimes. But together with international partners, Israel can serve as a generator of intellectual property and a test-bed for innovative solutions, challenging the economic and security vulnerability that the United States and Israel both face through gasoline dependence.

Israel has also set a national goal consistent with the Copenhagen Accord to increase its share of renewable energy in electricity generation to 10 percent by 2020. In the same period of time, Israel plans to reduce its electricity consumption by 20 percent.

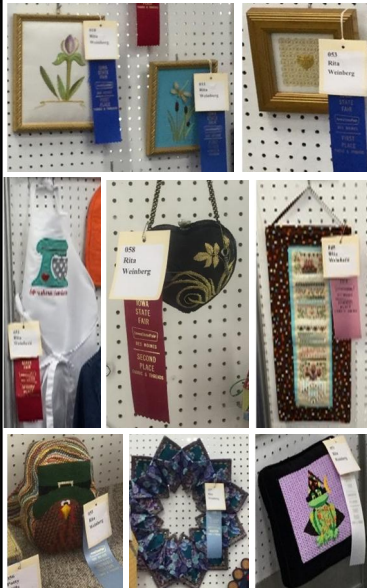

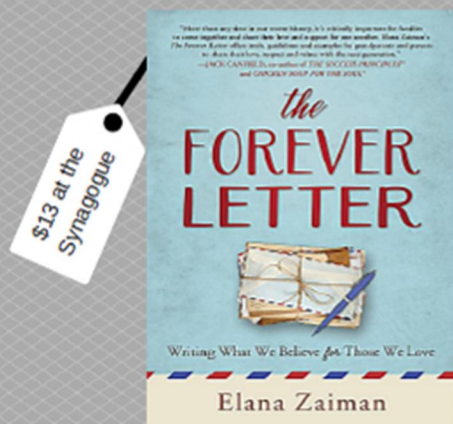

- The Four Species (palm branch, myrtle, willows, and citron) that we shake each day of Sukkot.
- Representative of the four types of Jews: (1) Jews who have learned much and do good deeds; (2) Jews who have learned much but do not do good deeds; (3) Jews who do good deeds but have not learned much; and (4) Jews who are neither learned nor do good deeds.
- Symbols of the parts of a human being: lulav = spine, myrtle = eyes, willow = mouth, and etrog = heart.
- Items you can use to make celebrating Sukkot with your family a special occasion.
- All of the above!

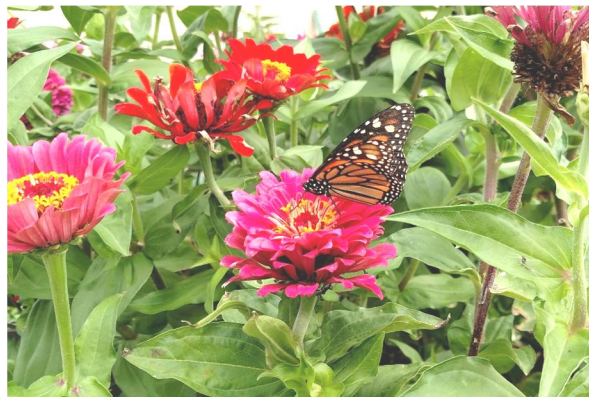

FORMER U.S. AMBASSADOR TO ISRAEL COMING TO DES MOINES

Daniel Shapiro was named Distinguished Visiting Fellow at Tel Aviv University's Institute of National Security Studies in March 2017, following a diverse career of over 20 years in senior foreign policy and national security positions in the United States government. He was appointed by President Barack Obama to be United States Ambassador to Israel, a position he held from July 2011 until the end of the Obama Administration. He won praise from leaders of both countries for his deft management of the U.S.-Israel relationship during Israeli-Palestinian peace negotiations, the Iran nuclear agreement, regional instability, and periods of significant bilateral tension and disagreement. Among his major contributions were negotiating the \$38 billion Memorandum of Understanding for U.S. military aid to Israel, unprecedented public outreach in fluent Hebrew to Israel's diverse communities, and 40 percent growth in U.S.-Israel trade. Shapiro previously served as Senior Director for the Middle East and North Africa on the National Security Council, in which he served as a member of Special Envoy George Mitchell's team, led U.S. diplomatic efforts in Syria and Lebanon, and advised President Obama through the early months of the upheavals in Arab states in 2011. He previously served in numerous senior advisory positions in the U.S. Congress, including with Senator Bill Nelson of Florida and Senator Dianne Feinstein of California.

His remarkable breadth of insights have been featured across the major media networks, and his writing has appeared in Foreign Policy, The Atlantic, Washington Post, CNN, MSNBC, Israeli Channel 2, and more. He holds degrees from Brandeis University and Harvard University, and is living with his wife, Julie Fisher, and their three daughters, in Raanana, Israel.

A Personal Journey to Share with Friends A collaborative project of TIS and TBJ
Chai Mitzvah combines study, ritual and social action, providing the framework for a meaningful Jewish journey.



Shalom! Being Jewish means you learn and do, all your life. Our tradition teaches us the world stands on Torah, Avodah, and Gmitut Chasadim - learning, spirituality and social action. That is, head, heart and hand.

We point our children's learning toward that moment when they become full members of our community, when they become Bar or Bat Mitzvah. What about after that? How do we develop, re-define our Jewish lives? The Adult Education committees of Tifereth Israel and B'nai Jeshurun have decided to launch an innovative initiative for adults, Chai Mitzvah.

Chai Mitzvah has five basic components in a twelve-month program:

- Group study - meeting monthly on a set curriculum

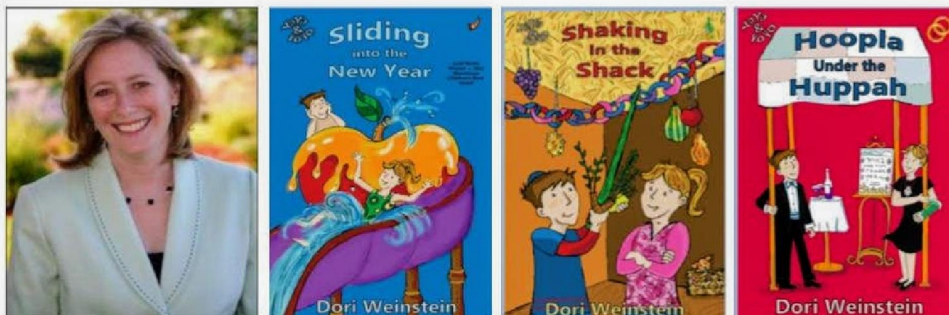

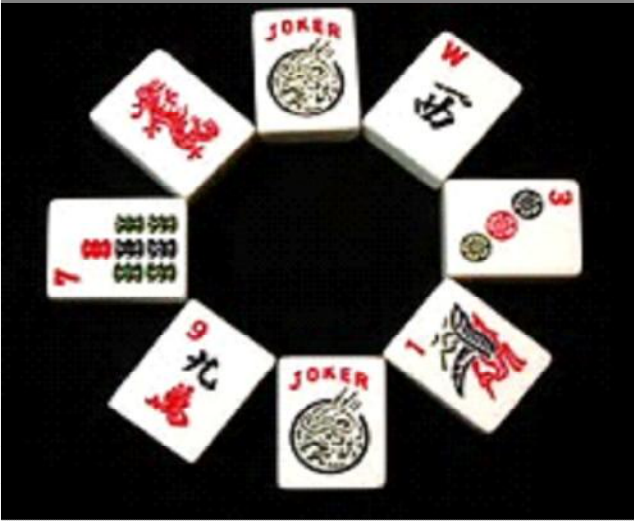

The DMARC Food Pantry Network, established in 1976, consists of 14 partner pantry sites, 14 Mobile Food Pantry sites, two food warehouses, and numerous community partners. It is the largest and oldest food pantry system in Iowa. Pantry sites are located in West Des Moines, Ankeny, Johnston, Clive and Urbandale, with eight sites in Des Moines.

Once per calendar month, families can receive a free, three-day supply of nutritionally balanced food. It's not enough for us to just fill stomachs, we want to provide nourishing food to those we serve. Families can also receive additional 'Anytime Items' every day at pantries. DMARC serves 16,000-17,000 individuals every month—60% of whom are children, youth and older adults.

Fruit Canned in its Own Juice

Fruit that is canned in water or its own juice is a great healthy donation option! DMARC can purchase fruit canned in its own juice, on average, for \$0.34 per can.

\$50 = 147 cans
\$100 = 294 cans

Peanut Butter

Peanut butter is a quick and convenient source of protein for the people we serve. DMARC can purchase peanut butter, on average, for \$0.83 per jar.

\$50 = 60 jars
\$100 = 120 jars



Healthy Cereal

Cereal is one of the staple breakfast items that we distribute through our Food Pantry Network. DMARC can purchase healthy cereal, on average, for \$1.04 per box.

\$50 = 48 boxes
\$100 = 96 boxes

Hint: When donating healthy cereal, look for varieties with less than 10 grams of sugar per serving. Examples include Cheerio's, Chex, Raisin Bran, and Rice Krispies. Avoid anything with marshmallows, sugar coating or chocolate.
