On October 13th, Herzl Camp will be visiting Tifereth for an evening of dinner, games, Havdalah and smores, and to talk about how awesome the camp is! Sue and I went to visit this summer and I am so excited to have them come and talk to families at Tifereth! It is a great place! For those of Kadima and USY age, look for programming geared to you developed by our new Kadima/USY advisor, Anna Zavell! She has so much great stuff planned, including a Kadima Escape Room and she'll be going with Kadima-niks to Ogden for Kadima Convention! Sign up, have fun, see your camp friends and make new ones!

We can't change the uncertainty and challenges that the world presents, but we can try to take advantage of and offer opportunities when we are able. I hope we see you soon, and you look for new ways to engage yourself in the tradition and the community!

Thomas Friedman's Challenge to Israel Philanthropy; Masorti is the Answer

Nearly every week a new story appears in the Israeli or American press that highlights the distress and disillusionment of mainstream American




The latest is New York Times Columnist Thomas Friedman, who was interviewed by the prominent Israeli National Religious weekly Makor Rishon. Freidman declared that he:

"... wanted Conservative and Reform rabbis to be officially recognized by the state, so that "their weddings and conversion be recognized..." I think the Kotel settlement should have been respected. You can't tell American Jews: We want you to come to Israel, but your form of Jewish-religious expression is unacceptable to us." Friedman's statements echo some of themes from mega-philanthropist Ronald Lauder's earlier op-ed in The New York Times. The Friedman interview is particularly significant because of his prominence as an opinion-leader on Israel, the passion of his statements, the predominantly Orthodox audience of Makor Rishon and the link in the story to a move by some synagogues away from Israel Bonds. Friedman underscored that he and his congregation would find alternative ways to support Israel, but were not comfortable operating through a government that he believes disrespects their Judaism.

The Masorti Foundation, and the Masorti Movement in Israel, continue to associate with Israel Bonds and at times receive Bonds when congregants choose to pass them along to Masorti as gifts. However, Friedman's story



highlights a roiling debate as some congregations follow his approach, while others that continue in the program have chosen to focus their Bonds work on support for Masorti, or have included direct giving to Masorti as an option.

The Masorti Foundation sees the religious services, Knesset advocacy, community-building and educational work of our partners in the Israeli Masorti Movement as a powerful expression of our core Jewish values – unity, pluralism, egalitarian practice, Jewish tradition and Zionism. Fighting for these values is an investment in Israel's future as a democratic and Jewish state, as envisioned in its Declaration of Independence, and a firm basis for Israel-Diaspora relations. And whether one follows Friedman away from traditional philanthropic tools like Israel Bonds, or seeks to re-frame them, Masorti, here and in Israel, are struggling for a respectful, values-based, 21st century relationship between Israel and Diaspora Jewry. We look forward to working with all in the community to find compelling ways to support this essential work.

New Directions Shelter - The Home Connection





MAIMONIDES, "A FAMOUS JEW"

Maimonides – "A Famous Jew," taught by David Friedgood, Thursdays, November 1st 6:30-7:30pm, 8th, 5:45-6:45pm, November 15th, 6:00–7:00pm & November 29th, 6:30-7:30pm

Four one-hour discussions will center on a review of the life and influence of the Rambam – Rabbi Moses ben Maimon – Maimonides. As the most famous commentator from the "Golden Age" of Jewish study in Medieval Spain, the Rambam revolutionized Jewish thought and practice. In this class we will explore Maimonides' background and look into his life as a Jewish Philosopher, a compiler of Jewish Law, and a Physician. From his writings we will review Maimonides' thoughts on the basic principles of Jewish faith and his universal outlook on the nature of human perfection.

A Personal Journey to Share with Friends A collaborative project of TIS and TBJ Chai Mitzvah combines study, ritual and social action, providing the framework for a meaningful Jewish journey.

CHAI MITZVAH Grow Your Judaism

Shalom! Being Jewish means you learn and do, all your life. Our tradition teaches us the world stands on Torah, Avodah, and Gmilut Chasadim - learning, spirituality and social action. That is, head, heart and hand.

We point our children's learning toward that moment when they become full members of our community, when they become Bar or Bat Mitzvah. What about after that? How do we develop, re-define our Jewish lives? The Adult Education committees of Tifereth Israel and B'nai Jeshurun have decided to launch an innovative initiative for adults, Chai Mitzvah.

Chai Mitzvah has five basic components in a twelve-month program:

- Group study meeting monthly on a set curriculum
- Independent study something you would like to learn more about in Jewish life, history, literature, culture, etc.
 Design your own independent study
- Ritual choosing a ritual or spiritual practice to incorporate into your life
- Social Action choosing either individually, or as a group to commit to a local volunteer opportunity
- Celebrate! At the end of the twelve months, acknowledge the journey with some kind of celebration. Participants who
 finish the program receive a certificate from Chai Mitzvah, and a tree planted in their honor courtesy of Jewish National
 Fund's collaboration with Chai Mitzvah.

Chai Mitzvah will meet on the **fourth Tuesday of the month at 6:30 PM beginning October 23rd**. Please note, December's meeting will be Tuesday the 18th. See over for the schedule and topics. Our Most Needed Items

Below is a list of our most needed food items. Whether you are donating funds or food, please keep these in mind!



Fruit Canned in its Own Juice

Fruit that is canned in water or its own juice is a great healthy donation option! DMARC can purchase fruit canned in its own juice, on average, for \$0.34 per can.

> \$50 = 147 cans \$100 = 294 cans

Peanut butter is a quick and convenient source of protein for the people we serve. DMARC can purchase peanut butter, on average, for \$0.83 per jar.

> \$50 = 60 jars \$100 = 120 jars





Healthy Cereal

Cereal is one of the staple breakfast items that we distribute through our Food Pantry Network, DMARC can purchase healthy cereal, on average, for \$1.04 per box.

> \$50 = 48 boxes \$100 = 96 boxes

Hint: When donating healthy cereal, look for varieties with less than 10 grams of sugar per serving. Examples include Cheerio's, Chex, Raisin Bran, and Rice Krispies. Avoid anything with marshmallows, sugar coating or chocolate.


