





FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY:

Summer Fun: Books, Films and the Iowa State Fair

It has been a very hot summer so far, but I feel like that just gives us a greater appreciation for activities that involve being in air-conditioned spaces, like reading, going to the movies, taking classes, and in my case, finishing up needlework that I will be entering into the Iowa State Fair! Our recent library reading project has been a big motivator not just for the community (Rita and MaryPaul said there has been more business in the library in the past month than in all the years they've been librarians!), but also for me. I have had the opportunity to read some great YA fiction books, including Sweep-about a girl chimney sweep who creates a golem (excellent read!) and The Inquisitor's Tale which is in the style of an illuminated manuscript and is about 3 children who save each other and a few books of the Talmud from one of the worst book burnings in medieval times. I have also begun reading for my High Holiday sermons: the reading list is vast and would probably surprise you. I'll keep you in suspense about it, or you can ask me when you see me. I'd also love to hear what you've been reading this summer! Kristin made some great "Community Book Recommendation" cards. Like Barnes & Noble, we will put these near books that people

enjoy. If you are a kid and don't want to write, you can use your recommendation space to draw a picture for us! I have also decided to start a quarterly Israel book club, in which we read fiction and non-fiction about the Israel experience. This will be a club meant to engage discussion, so the books won't always be easy to read (all in English, though), but should provoke deep thinking. It will begin after the High Holidays, and I may already have one book decided...!

Here at the synagogue, we've been dancing around the idea of an Israel book club and Jewish film series/festival for a while, because another good thing to do during those hot summer days is go to the movies or peruse Netflix. I finally picked a movie for Tisha B'Av (August 11): we will be watching *Waltz with Bashir*-an Academy Award-nominated animated Israeli film about experiences of soldiers during the first Lebanese war. It is


chilling and poignant, a great film for the saddest day of the year. Think of it as a kick-off for doing more regular film screenings in the future! The movies will always be Jewish in content, and sometimes we will even pick funny ones! I get emails from film distributers about new Jewish films, but don't always have the time to watch the free screeners in order to decide what we might watch as a community. If this is something you would be interested in doing: being part of a committee that screens films for community watching, let me know.

August always brings the State Fair—not only where I grew up, where the Fair is at the end of August—but of course the best State Fair: the Iowa State Fair. I have decided to be courageous this year and enter several pieces in the Needlework division, which is displayed on the 2nd floor of the Varied Industries Building where the quilts are. We'll see how I do...there are some great stitchers out there, including in our own congregation! I know there are congregants entering in various divisions, from Agriculture to Fabric and Threads. We would love to keep a lookout for your entries so please let the community know if your artistry/garden products are on display this year!

And lastly, the High Holidays are later this year (Rosh Hashanah begins September 29th) but it will be here before you know it and there is so much to do to get ready! If you are up for volunteering, including ushering or doing security, please let the office or Barb know. If you receive a call asking if you would like an honor, please take it! Before then, though, we hope you will find ways to spiritually prepare either on your own or with us in our early September Entryways into Elul program (see the calendar in the bulletin). It is always so wonderful to see all of you, and I hope our paths cross

very soon!

ISRAEL NEWS & INFORMATION

Around 1970 Al [Mintzer] and I received a flyer in the mail advertising a trip to Israel that was reasonably priced. Having never been out of the United States, and finally having saved some money, we decided this was a great opportunity to take a fantastic trip.

Being in Israel is like living in the Bible. The geography, the archaeology, the blending of cultures and religions. Having been raised in Iowa with a Jewish population of .2% we were overwhelmed being immersed among so many of our religion.

On Friday evening our plans was to visit the Wailing Wall, the remnant of the Great Temple which had been destroyed in Biblical times. This part of the Western Wall had been restored with a plaza for those visiting. The Wall is divided into 2 sections, observing Orthodox tradition, one for men and one for women. It is a custom to place written prayers within the crevices which we planned to do. As the sun sets, rabbinical students arrive and dance within the plaza area.

We had two magical moments that evening.

The first, as the students started dancing, we recognized the rabbi who was leading the procession. He was **Rabbi Simon Eckstein**, from Ottawa, Canada, and his daughter was living in Des Moines and Al had delivered her children. We spoke with him and he invited us to his home to visit.

The second event was unbelievable.

We started walking back to our hotel and then realized we did not know if we were going in the right direction. I looked behind me and saw a couple and recognized the woman. I had spoken to her at the Wall and she had informed me she was from the US and they made frequent trips to Israel. I said to AI, "let us wait up for them and I am sure they can help us".

When they approached they informed us we were going in the right direction and they would walk with us to make sure we did not get lost. As we walked, Al casually asked where they were from in the US and they replied, "Cleveland, Ohio". "Oh", we said, "we have good friends in Des Moines who used to live in Cleveland, we wonder if you know them?" "What are their names?" "Dick and Lois Brown". (80,000 Jews live in Cleveland)

At that time, the husband casually reached into his pocket, pulled out his billfold and showed us a picture of Dick and Lois Brown. He said, "Dick is my best friend, he is my brother."

As a side note, I took a trip to the Ukraine twenty years ago with my 2 sisters and a niece. At breakfast in our hotel in Kiev we met a photojournalist who was traveling with a rabbi and another person from Chicago. When they appeared, she introduced them to us. He said his name was **Rabbi Yechiel Eckstein**. I then said, "I know a Rabbi Simon Eckstein from Ottawa, Canada." He then said, "that is my father" and I said, "And Ahuva is your sister!"

ISRAEL NEWS-AIPAC IOWA EVENT















A major milestone for American and Israeli security

On Sunday, the United States and Israel announced a successful test of the Arrow-3 missile defense system in Kodiak, Alaska – an extraordinary demonstration of American-Israeli defense cooperation.

One of the most immediate security challenges facing Israel today is Iran's ballistic missile arsenal, which the regime in Tehran continues to enhance. Americans and Israelis have partnered to address the threat, and AIPAC has been at the intersection of this important collaboration from the very beginning. I encourage you to view the spectacular footage below, which demonstrates the achievement of deploying Arrow-3 to execute a pinpoint interception of an incoming missile outside the Earth's atmosphere. Since the 1990s, Congress has allocated over \$7 billion for U.S.-Israel missile defense programs – including over \$3.4 billion for the Arrow. At AIPAC's urging, and with your help, Congress has regularly increased funding for the development and deployment of the system. Another key challenge for Israel – given its close proximity to surrounding hostile neighbors – has been finding a test location to accommodate a realistic launch of the Arrow-3 system. Two years ago, AIPAC successfully lobbied Congress to approve additional funding (\$105 million) for this exercise in Alaska. This remarkable development showcases the best of what both allies can offer each other through close collaboration, strategic partnership, and a shared commitment to mutual security. Americans and Israelis are safer when the two countries work together. That is the core of why this relationship – and our work together to strengthen it – matters.

DSM ART CENTER EXHIBITION FROM TONI URBAN

Queer Abstraction

On view at the Des Moines Art Center through **September 8, 2019** in the Anna K. Meredith Gallery and I. M. Pei Building.

Queer Abstraction is the first exhibition in the Des Moines Art Center's 70-year history to focus exclusively on queer sexuality and gender identity. This group exhibition presents contemporary artwork in a variety of media that implicitly refers to queer desires, alternative identities, and related histories. Queer Abstraction is organized by Assistant Curator Jared Ledesma.

Mark Joshua Epstein (b. 1979) is one of the artists featured in the exhibition and has been named the fourth Toni and Tim Urban International Artist-in-Residence at the Des Moines Art Center. Funding for this residency was established in 2015 with the aim of bringing artists from foreign countries, particularly of Jewish heritage, to the Art Center and the communities we serve.

Epstein is a visual artist, curator, and educator. He received his MFA from the Slade School of Fine Arts, University College London (London, England) and a BFA from the School of the Museum of Fine Arts and Tufts University (Boston, MA). He has had solo or two-person shows at many of North America's finest museums and galleries and has been a resident at Vermont Studio Center, NARS Foundation, Saltonstall Foundation, among others. He is the recipient of a Traveling Scholar award for alumni from the School of the Museum of Fine Arts Boston. He has also taught extensively at museums in New York City including The Jewish Museum, the Museum of Modern Art, and the Whitney Museum of American Art. Epstein divides his time between Brooklyn, NY and Ann Arbor, MI.

In addition to having his work featured prominently in *Queer Abstraction* and participating in a gallery talk

about his work with Ledesma on Thursday, August 8 at 6:30 p.m. (reservations available at desmoinesartcenter.org), Epstein is serving as a guest educator in several capacities for the Art Center

including leading experiences for LGBTQ community leaders, people with dementia and their care

partners, and teens participating in the museum's Art & Activism workshop.



Michael, a graduate of Fordham University, holds a Ph.D. in Pharmaceutics and Analytical Chemistry from the University of lowa. He is retired after working for more than four decades as a scientist and researcher.
