

Important Information

Front Door Security Measure - Congregants to receive Key FOB for entry to Tifereth

The Tifereth Israel Synagogue building doors will now be locked at all times. During business hours you will still have to be buzzed in and your key FOB will only work before and after services. Each member family will be able to request up to two key fobs. If you choose not to get a Key FOB, you will be let in to the building when you arrive for services or another events. At larger events, like a bar or bat mitzvah or the High Holidays, there will be security in place at the front door. If you only frequent the synagogue at the High Holidays or for other large events, you may not want to get a key fob at this time.



Adult Education Committee

The Adult Education committee works Rabbi and the Board to plan and promote adult education opportunities in the synagogue, including regular classes, lectures and invited scholars-in residence.

Building and Grounds Committee

Oversee the maintenance of the building and the property grounds. Responsibilities include coordinate lawn care and snow removal & coordinate repair/maintenance work with contractors and Barb Berven. Review maintenance/service contracts.

Chesed Committee

Call on members in the hospital, shut-ins and seniors. Prepares treat bags for seniors on Rosh Hashanah, Hanukkah and Purim.

Fundraising, Budget & Dues Equalization Committee

Plan events to raise money for the Synagogue. Work with the budget and dues equalization.

Financial Committee

Reviews, prepares, and implements a financially sound budget for Tifereth Israel Synagogue operations.

Garden Committee

Produces and cares for the Tifereth Community Garden in the Rosenblatt Family garden next to the synagogue. Both vegetables, herbs and flowers are produced and shared. We encourage all members to get involved, both adults and children alike.

Membership Committee

Develops and maintain membership application, work with the Executive Committee, Board of Directors and staff to establish yearly goals for membership recruitment, retention, reinstatement and review applications. Develop marketing materials and strategies for recruiting new members.

Music Committee

Music Committee works with the Rabbi and the board to continue the Tifereth tradition of enhancing our services with high-quality music and musicians. The committee advises and supports the High Holiday choir and any other choir events as well as support, recruit, promote any musical performances in-house. The committee advises any Cantor/Cantorial Soloist or Cantorial Intern.

Pomerantz Library Committee

Assist library users, order books for the library, catalog and cover books, evaluate donations, help encourage members to use the library through bulletin articles, implementing reading programs as well as tidy the library.

Safety Community

Coordinates the safety and security of the Tifereth Israel Grounds and works with funding for securing the premise.

Tikkun Olam Committee

Strives to provide congregants with opportunities to work together and make a difference in our local community. Since the current committee's inception in 2010, the committee has primarily focused on hunger issues and promoted better environmental practices at Tifereth.

Ritual Committee

The Ritual Committee serves at the discretion of the Rabbi providing insight, perspective, input and feed back on question of ritual, worship and related matters. Although the committee is not ultimately a decision-making a committee, as the rabbi is the *mara d'atra* of the synagogue, it plays a key role in the organization, support and promotion of worship-related activities and other matters related to Jewish law in the synagogue.

Adult Education

Weekly Shabbat Lunch and Learn

Saturdays, About 12:30-1:15pm. Stay for Kiddush and learning after services! Bring your questions and opinions! Texts will be read in English, but Hebrew will also beprovided. Note: There will not be a Torah discussion on the weekends there is a bar or bat mitzvah. Topics change throughout the year.

STEP: Sunday Torah Education Program

Sunday Torah Education Program, moderated by Mike Kuperman, Sundays, 10:00am–12:00pm. STEP is a study group that has traditionally been focused on the study of Jewish texts. The group is open to Tifereth members, members of other synagogues, nonaffiliated Jews and others. Study topics have included Torah and Haftarah, as well as Jewish History and Culture courses from the Great Course Catalog, presentations by local and national Jewish professionals and cast members from local Jewish-themed plays.

Torah Scroll Classes

Have you ever wanted to get closer to the Torah scroll? **Everyone** is invited to participate and learn. Some things will only take 5 minutes to learn, Torah Repair and chanting take longer. Times for workshops or tutorials will be based on the responses we get from people like you! Please contact Sue Harris sue.harris@tifereth.org to get started!

- Hagbah, lifting a Torah—Tifereth needs YOU! In 10 minutes learn the fundamentals to the honor of lifting the Torah in Services! It's easy and important! Come Simchat Torah services Tuesday morning, October 2nd. Enjoy dancing with the Torah. Then stay after services, to learn to lift the Torah. Can't make it? Let us know you're interested and we'll schedule another time on a Shabbos after kiddush!
- **Gelilah** In just a few minutes, learn how to dress the Torah so it can be returned to the ark, after it is read during services. Can be taught after kiddush on Shabbos days, based on interest expressed.
- Maintaining and repairing Torahs- The Torah scroll requires ongoing maintenance and repair. Once a
 month join Andy Goodman for this basic skills course on Torah care.
- Rolling a Torah Scroll- Torahs need to be rolled regularly for 2 main reasons:
 - **1.** To keep them healthy and kosher. Come learn the simple movement needed and sign up to be a Holy Roller! Our Torahs need your help!
 - 2. To be rolled to it's proper place, for it to be read on Shabbos and holidays. Can you decode Hebrew? If so, come learn how to use resources such as a luach and tikkun, so you can help prepare the Torah scrolls to be read. You can also take pictures and email them to leyners, to help them prepare their Torah portions. It doesn't take long to learn this skill or to do it. Another great way to help the community!
- **Gabbai training** Gabbais orchestrate the Torah service, including calling people up for honors and assisting people chanting Torah. If you can read Hebrew and follow along during the service, then this Gabbai class may be for you! It's never too late to learn a new skill and help out in the community. Join us **Saturday**, **December 15th after Kiddush**. Current gabbais are requested to attend so we can review, discuss best practices and update on new procedures.
- Chanting from the Torah- Would you love to learn to leyn/chant from our sacred Torah scrolls? Can you decode Hebrew? Can you sing happy birthday? If yes, then you can learn to leyn, Sue Harris would love to teach you & we need you!!! Just let her know if you need a refresher or want to start from the very beginning.

We encourage all members to get involved, both adults and children alike. Some of the accomplishments of the garden committee are-

- In 2012 raised bed gardens were added for easier accessibility for all.
- In 2013 a native plants bed was added to attract pollinators and butterflies to Tifereth's grounds and beautify the large expanse of yard. This environmental effort expanded to an Old Growth Prairie Bed in 2014, using seeds from the Tipton, lowa native prairie. We also planted black raspberry bushes along the building and additional plants and trees on the grounds
- In 2016, Polk County Conservation chose Tifereth and nine other Des Moines congregations to install native pollinator gardens. We planted the 200 donated pollinator plants to expand our prairie bed.

Purpose:

To support our congregation's costs. Our operational cost is \$2200 per member unit. At Tifereth Israel, our staff and facility are supported by your contributions (dues). As the Torah instructs us, we ought to give according to our means. We must rely on ourselves to sustain this Kehilla (community). Also, providing dues is a vital part of joining our community. It helps support and enrich Jewish life in Des Moines.

Guiding Practice:

We suggest a minimum of \$1200 for a family and \$600 for an individual per year. In addition, we suggest a dues raise of 2% each year to adjust as prices raise. Families and individuals can also contribute to the community through volunteer opportunities in addition to financial payments.

However, we ask that you study your own situation and make a personal decision about what you are able to afford based on a self-assessment of your family's financial means and priorities. As in many families and true to ours, we rely upon one another to help support those with more difficult financial situations due to reduced income or lost jobs in this challenging economy. The Dues are set by the Board, and the Membership committee determines the dues for first year congregants.

Payment:

Annual Dues pledges are sent out on May 1, the beginning of our fiscal year. Please fill out and return the pledge no later than <u>June 1</u>. Tifereth Israel accepts Visa and MasterCard to pay dues. If you wish to use that method please consider increasing your contribution 2-3% to cover the financial charge we incur. Free ACH (automatic withdrawal) can be set up with your bank or you may make monthly payment arrangements with our office or treasurer. Installment payments shall commence June 1.

Dues delinquencies must be resolved prior to use of synagogues' resources and before a member may be re-accepted after resigning their membership. By mutual agreement, no other synagogue in Des Moines will accept a member whose dues are delinquent at his/her previous synagogue. Please contact the office if special consideration/accommodation is needed.
