Levitical Lessons in the Time of COVID-19

It has been fitting that during this time of the Coronavirus/ COVID-19 pandemic we have been reading the book of Leviticus. The book of Leviticus is usually one of the most unpopular, "boring" books in the Torah and is dreaded by rabbis and bnei mitzvah students alike. However, the book of Leviticus spends a lot of time discussing disease, bodily functions, and how to deal with these physical challenges and each other properly and with compassion, during good times and bad. The middle of Leviticus really centers on disease, especially skin afflictions and ruptures and many other medical issues, and how to proceed if you have any of them. To the modern reader, some of what is prescribed by the Torah for treatment seems very primitive for today with all of our advances in modern medicine, but in fact it offers thousands of years old wisdom that we are still following and is all the more relevant and important at this present moment. In the Torah, if a person presents with a contagious disease, or even a disease that might appear to be contagious, they must go to the priest and be checked out. One week of isolation is prescribed, and if the person is examined at the end of seven days with a status that is unchanged, then he must return to isolation for another seven days, and the process continues. Only if the symptoms seem to have faded after the initial isolation of seven days, then the person may come out of isolation and rejoin the community. He or she is still pronounced unclean, though, and must wash before re-entry. The Torah, in which community preservation was so important, saw how critical containment and cleanliness were as strategies to combat infection. seem so primitive now, and it is amazing that this wisdom-of isolation to prevent infection spread—after all we have discovered, is still the best way, according to doctors, to deal with community safety in the face of epidemic illness.

One of the most significant and well-known Hebrew legal phrases is "pikuach nefesh docheh hakol" which in English translates into "saving a life overrides everything." The rabbis linked this to a verse in the Torah from Leviticus that says: "You shall keep My laws and My rules, by the pursuit of which man The Talmud comments on this with emphasis and says: "That he shall live by them, and not that he shall die by them." This principle, considered by many rabbis to be one of the highest values in Judaism has stayed at the top of the proverbial rabbi list for more than 1500 years. In the Shulchan Arukh, which was published in the mid-1500s, and which is considered one of the most important Jewish legal documents for rabbis, even today, Joseph Karo writes that one is not merely permitted-one is required to disregard a law that conflicts with life or health. He writes: "It is a religious precept to desecrate the Sabbath for any person afflicted with an illness that may prove dangerous; he who is zealous is praiseworthy while he who asks questions or challenges the preservation of life and health above observing Shabbat sheds blood." In other words, since life is so valuable to Judaism and the Jewish people (remember L'chaim! doesn't actually mean to life, it means "to lives!"), we must do all we can to preserve the lives of everyone in our community, even when it is uncomfortable, stressful, or anxiety-provoking. Following in that tradition, I am very proud of everything we have done at the synagogue to keep members safe and healthy. We have moved all of our programming and services online. Christy is currently the

only one in the office on a regular basis, and Manuel is continually disinfecting and deep-cleaning the building. have had nice services on zoom for those who want to participate, though many people I have talked to seem to also like having the break from services, especially now while things are so stressful at home. I have received emails from congregants expressing their own pride at how we have responded thus far. I am also very proud of each of our congregants, each of you, who are taking this so seriously. You really understand that preserving life, even if that means living in isolation, like the Torah would have asked you to do so many years ago, in this challenging and scary time is the most important thing you can do, even when it is difficult. I see your Facebook posts and talk to you, and know that you are living that value every day. The synagogue is still here for everyone, and still will be after we are able to safely gather once again, and how nice that will be. Jewish communities have weathered much worse in the past, though, and we have always made it through and even thrived. We must not forget that.

In Leviticus, after all the ailments, possible ailments, and their remedies are discussed, including for homes that probably had severe mold issues (they also face a sort of isolation, no one can live in them and then they also must be cleaned) the Torah offers a variety of ceremonies for the person returning from isolation into the community, based on the time away, the ailment and the socio-economic status of the person. As you might expect, it involves a lot of animal sacrifice, even an anointing ceremony for the one returning to the community similar to what Aaron and his sons received when they became priests for the Israelite community. I think there is great wisdom in this as well, wisdom that we can again appreciate today. I am not suggesting sacrifice, or a blood spattered bima, or even putting oil on each of your ears, but after this has slowed down and we are able to begin to gather again, even in small groups, it will feel weird to just start everything up again. Judaism as a religion is very good at marking time with ritual. We will need a way to mark the transition, our own ceremony of sorts. I'm just starting to think about what that might look like and maybe you are too.

I know that the day will come soon where will be able to be in person together for services and classes, though for some of us, I know it is not soon enough. I am always thinking about the preservation of life above anything else, and what we are doing as a community now is not only very Jewish, it is the right thing. The Torah teaches us now and throughout this time of pandemic that we must not avoid illness and contagious disease, but we must face it head on, HOWEVER, that comes with isolation from the community in order to save the community. It is not just something we are doing for ourselves as individuals but as a community, for the community. And when it is over, we can be with each other again, and that will definitely be worth celebrating!






What are some customs and practices for Shavuot?

- In order to mark the agricultural history of Shavuot, some decorate their house and synagogues with a floral theme.


