President's Report

The past year's financial success was built upon the Torah Dedication event that Will Rogers organized last year. That final fundraiser of the year benefitted us this year and will do so into the next. In the past, I have mentioned fundraising as an issue that TI needs to better address. The Mah Jongg Tournament is part of the answer. Continued support of the Calendar is another. We will continue to look for additional creative fundraising events as we move forward.

This past year we signed Rabbi Emily Barton to another 3 year contract. I'd like to thank Brian Pearl, Don Schoen, and Justin Schoen for their efforts in negotiating that contract with the rabbi. We are happy to have her continue to lead us into the future.

This past year we received a very generous gift from Lou and Marilyn Hurwitz to construct an addition to our facility that will house a mikvah. With the loss of Beth El Jacob we lost access to a community mikvah, and the Hurwitz's are correcting that. I have had the occasion to use a mikvah for 2 of my children, and my wife Christina has made use of it also. A mikvah has been a tool by the Lederman families since my mom got dipped at Beth El in the mid-60's.

In addition to the mikvah, our architect created renderings for a new outdoor space on the west side of our property. This includes additional gardens, a new playground, and beautiful outdoor spaces to congregate. We are asking for your help to make this exciting project a reality.
